

Fulbright Distinguished Awards in Teaching Program for International Teachers Application

The Fulbright Distinguished Awards in Teaching Program for International Teachers will bring approximately 22 international primary and secondary teachers to the United States from August to December 2027 to take courses for professional development at a host university, and observe, collaborate, and share their expertise with U.S. colleagues. The Fulbright Distinguished Awards in Teaching Program for International Teachers is a semester-long non-degree, non-credit, professional development program at a U.S. university. Participants will audit courses in the host university's school or department of education and, thus, will be part of the university community. The program will include opportunities to observe and co-teach with U.S. teachers in a U.S. school near the host university, in order to actively engage participants in the U.S. classroom environment. Cultural enrichment, mentoring, and support will be provided throughout the program.

After returning home, educators who successfully complete the program will be eligible to compete for small grants for essential teaching materials, to offer follow-on training for other educators, for collaborative projects with participating U.S. schools, and other activities that build on the exchange experience. Grant competitions are contingent on federal funding and may not be offered every year.

ABOUT THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF STATE'S BUREAU OF EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL AFFAIRS (ECA)

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must:

- Spend at least 50 percent of their time working with students in a school that serves a primarily local (not expatriate) population. Applicants who are teacher trainers in relevant countries do not need to work directly with primary and secondary students, but must work with primary or secondary pre-service or in-service teachers at least fifty percent of their time;
- Have earned a bachelor's degree or equivalent education and experience;
- By the start of the program, have at least three years of full-time teaching experience or working directly with students in some other capacity (as a guidance counselor, library media specialist, etc.); however, preference will be given to applicants with five or more years of experience;
- In Botswana, Brazil, India, Indonesia, Mexico, Morocco, the Philippines, or Senegal teacher trainers are also eligible to apply;
- Be a citizen of and resident in a program eligible location;
- Demonstrate English language skills adequate to audit university courses and to teach, lead seminars, and give presentations in U.S. schools.. Candidates from Botswana, Brazil, India, Indonesia, Mexico, Morocco, the Philippines, or Senegal must have a minimum TOEFL iBT score of 61, or equivalent;
- Demonstrate a commitment to continue teaching or working in primary or secondary education for at least five years after completion of the program; and
- Have submitted a complete application;

A candidate who has resided in the United States for five or more consecutive years in the six-year period preceding the date of application is ineligible for a grant. A candidate who has lived in the United States for nine months or more during a calendar year is deemed to have resided abroad for that year.

If you have participated in other U.S. government-funded professional development exchange programs, please contact the Fulbright Commission/U.S. Embassy in your country to inquire about your eligibility.

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Preference will be given to qualified candidates who have not previously had a Fulbright and to those who have not had substantial recent experience in the United States. Alumni of teacher exchange programs funded by the State Department's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, and other professional exchange programs in the United States (including Fulbright TEA, SUSI, IVLP, Access, Fulbright Classroom Teacher Exchange, PDPI in Brazil etc.) or other Western countries are eligible to apply for Fulbright Teacher Exchange Programs; however preference will be given to applicants who completed these programs at least three years before the start of the program for which they are applying and can demonstrate that the program has had significant impact on their professional practice. Applicants with previous professional experience in the United States should demonstrate in their applications, how they have implemented in their teaching practice what they learned during this experience.

Personal travel, leading student trips, non-degree study as an undergraduate, religious trips or volunteering, secondary school or summer camp exchanges, and participation in the Summer Work Travel program are not considered professional exchanges in the United States.

Please note that this program is not intended for alumni of the International Leaders in Education Program.

The Fulbright Distinguished Awards in Teaching Program for International Teachers is a program for practicing teachers and other educators working in primary or secondary education. Ministry of Education officials, full-time principals or educational administrators, university faculty, private English Language tutors and teachers from schools primarily serving expatriates are not eligible. **Part-time and substitute teachers, or teachers without a permanent teaching position, are not eligible.**

Current IREX employees and consultants and their immediate family members (spouses, parents, children, and siblings) are not eligible to compete in any IREX-implemented grant programs, either as individuals or as the responsible party representing an institutional applicant.

Staff or families of staff at a U.S. Embassy or Fulbright Commission are not eligible to apply.

For a period of one year after employment or service, employees or immediate family members of employees of U.S. missions abroad who work for the U.S. Department of State, or the U.S. Agency for International Development are not eligible to participate in this program. This includes paid or unpaid employees and consultants; board members or staff of a Fulbright Commission; officers of an organization, in the United States or abroad, and individuals otherwise associated with the organization responsible for nominating or selecting individuals for participation in any exchange program of the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs. This does not disqualify interns or self-supporting children who live apart from their parents.

The Fulbright Distinguished Awards in Teaching Program for International Teachers is not designed for PhD research. The program is practice-based and primarily focused on education leadership and sharing best practices in education.

APPLICATIONS NOT MEETING THE ABOVE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS WILL NOT BE FORWARDED TO THE REVIEW COMMITTEE.

IREX reserves the right to verify all of the information included in the application. In the event that there is a discrepancy, or information is found to be false, the application will immediately be declared invalid and the applicant ineligible.

SELECTION PROCESS AND CRITERIA

Participants will be selected through a merit-based open competition based on eligibility and the criteria below. Top candidates will be interviewed by an interview panel. Top candidates must take the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) or provide valid results from within the past year, (test date no earlier than June 30, 2025), if applying from, Botswana, Brazil, India, Indonesia, Mexico, Morocco, the Philippines, or Senegal

Selection Criteria:

- Demonstrated commitment to primary or secondary education;
- Demonstrated leadership potential;
- Professional and educational experience and achievements;
- Potential for developing long-term linkages between U.S. and home community educational institutions and schools;
- Preparedness (including maturity, flexibility, and ability to function independently) for an **intensive** U.S.-based training program with very limited free time for personal travel or sightseeing;
- Willingness and capacity to work and live collaboratively with international peers to foster a positive learning community for professional development;
- Articulated ideas for applying program experience to improving primary or secondary education in home community upon return (candidates should be planning to continue working in primary or secondary education for at least five years after the conclusion of the program);
- Ability to express ideas clearly and effectively;
- English language skills adequate to audit university courses and to teach, lead seminars, and give presentations in U.S. schools (candidates from Botswana, Brazil, India, Indonesia, Mexico, Morocco, the Philippines, or Senegal must have a minimum TOEFL iBT score of 61 or an equivalent English Language examination);
- Preference will also be given to applicants who have had few or no opportunities to travel to the U.S., and who have not previously received a Fulbright grant.
- If a person received an advanced degree from the United States, preference will be given to those who completed their degree at least 8 years ago.






